



Every winter, Beaver Creek Reserve takes part in the Christmas Bird Count, the longest-running bird census in the world, and it is driven by citizen scientists! We organized five count circles this year: Holcombe, Chippewa Falls, Beaver Creek Reserve, Durand, and Nelson. In total, we counted 23,354 birds representing 63 total species, covering nearly 2,300 miles over the course of 214 hours. 56 birders contributed to this effort! Data is still being submitted, but those 23,354 birds are part of the over 22,700,000 birds counted across 1426 circles worldwide!

All 5 circles had an above-average number of species, 3/5 had more individual birds counted than average. The Nelson circle had the most species (48) and the most birds (8224)

The 5 most abundant bird species are as follows:

European Starling: 3034

American Crow: 2874

Dark-eyed Junco: 2295 (+4 Oregon Juncos)

Rock Pigeon: 1739

Common Goldeneye: 1532

The Christmas bird count is a very old dataset stretching back decades, this being the 126th iteration. The Holcombe, Chippewa Falls, and Nelson count circles were established in the 50s, which can provide insight into how bird populations have changed. Here are a few trends and notes from the data.

A good year for **Red-breasted Nuthatches**, although not all that spectacular compared to other irruption years.

**House Sparrow** numbers continue to decline across all counts. Where there used to be thousands, there are now only a couple hundred. **American crows** have generally been increasing, although some circles have had a rough decade.

Another year without any **Evening Grosbeaks** despite the irruption, barely 14 have been counted across all 5 circles since 2001. Other species that have disappeared from the CBCs include **Bobwhite**, **Sharp-tailed Grouse**, **Red-headed Woodpecker**, and **Common Grackle**.

**Eurasian Collared-doves** continue expanding into the region, with consistent detection and higher numbers than in previous years.

An excellent year for **Bald Eagles** and **Wild Turkeys**, all circles had the highest counts in ~~over~~ a decade!
