Who? Anyone interested in birds especially novice birders, students, backyard birdwatchers, hunters, farmers, landowners, early career natural resource professionals.



This fun and engaging course has been designed specifically for beginners who want to learn more about birds and take the next step in birding. This 2-1/2 day course will combine classroom lectures, field trips, group lessons and hands-on activities to give you a full learning experience. Knowledgeable birders will help you learn the basics of bird behavior, migration, identification, and reproduction. We'll explain how to identify birds using size, shape, plumage, and other field marks. We'll teach you how to find birds in different habitats. We'll teach you to listen to birds and how to identify their songs. We'll discuss how you can help birds and protect the places they depend on.

Modeled after successful Master Naturalist programs in more than 25 states, the Wisconsin Master Naturalist (WIMN) program provides education, training, and service opportunities for adult volunteers who are passionate about conserving the state's natural resources.

Program participants receive 40 hours of coursework in natural history, education, interpretation, conservation stewardship, and resource monitoring. Courses combine classroom instruction with field experiences and are taught by WIMN instructors trained to deliver the Volunteer Training Course. Training opportunities are hosted by organizations such as nature centers, state parks, and museums across the state.



Chippewa Valley Watercolor Artists Celebrate 25 Years

The Chippewa Valley Watercolor Artists began as a result of Janet Carson's on-location watercolor class the summer of 1993. Two members of the class, Joyce Aaker and Bette Wahl, began discussing the possibility of continuing to paint together. After finding others that would be interested in being a part of this painting group, a name for the group was chosen, and in 1994, Beaver Creek Reserve became home to the Watercolor Artists. Nine artists from the group exhibited their first works in December of that year, showcasing 28 pieces in total.

Artists are reflective beings, they create because they must. They experience the joys as well as the frustrations. And they also experience the desire to share, not only what they have created, but also to share ideas and techniques with other artists, which is just what this group offers.

Over the years many members have come and gone. There are currently about 30 members who come together to paint. Each member brings their own work to do and problems to solve. While there is no instruction, they learn new methods from each other during critiques. Everyone is expected to show their "in progress" work during the critiques as well as offering suggestions regarding technique, procedures, etc. Each year we also invite a guest artist in for a two day workshop. This past year we had, in addition to the annual Beaver Creek show, shows at the Heyde Center, the L.E. Phillips Library and various venues in the area.

As this year marks 25 years since our group came together, there will be a 25th Anniversary Show and Sale on view from March 6 - April 2 at Beaver Creek Reserve. An opening reception will be on March 9, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., in conjunction with Beaver Creek's French Toast Breakfast. There will also be a children's paint and take table, as well as cards for sale. A portion of all sales will go to Beaver Creek.
